Football Coaches Inspire the Next Generation

On Friday 3rd March, we were pleased to welcome Nigel James and Anthony Gale at our school. Nigel James is a renowned football coach, who was born and bred in Lambeth. He is also the father of Reece James and Lauren James; both of his children play for Chelsea Football Club and represent England Senior Men's and Women's teams. Nigel has had extensive experience developing players at 'Nigel James Elite Coaching', as well as teaching football in primary schools in the Richmond, Surrey district since 2003. Anthony Gale works alongside Nigel at 'Nigel James Elite Coaching' and he also has extensive experience as a football coach as well as Head of youth development at professional academies. Anthony is currently managing football teams for the Nigel James Academy.



In November 2021, Nigel donated football kits to our school football team and this was a great moment for the children to meet him and receive some valuable football tips; hearing about his journey to his current position and the key qualities he developed through sport.

And finally, some of you may be fasting at the moment for Ramadan.

As some of you may be aware, Ramadan, in Islam, is the ninth month of the Muslim calendar and the holy month of fasting. It begins and ends with the appearance of the crescent moon. Because the Muslim calendar year is shorter than the Gregorian calendar year, Ramadan begins 10–12 days earlier each year, allowing it to fall in every season throughout a 33-year cycle. During the month of Ramadan, Muslims won't eat or drink between dawn
