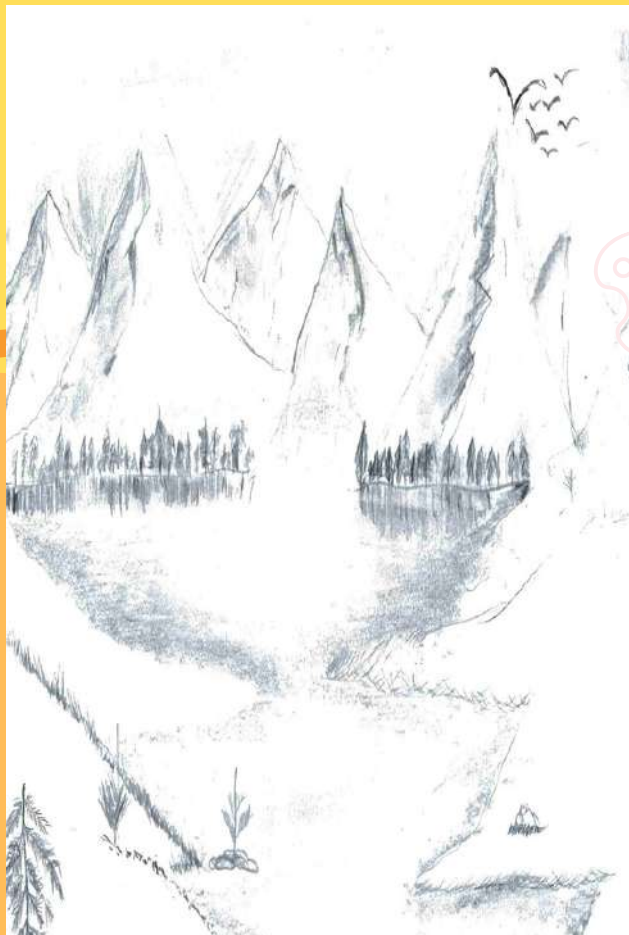
Last year, Shireen House (Blue) gained the most compass coins for the summer term.

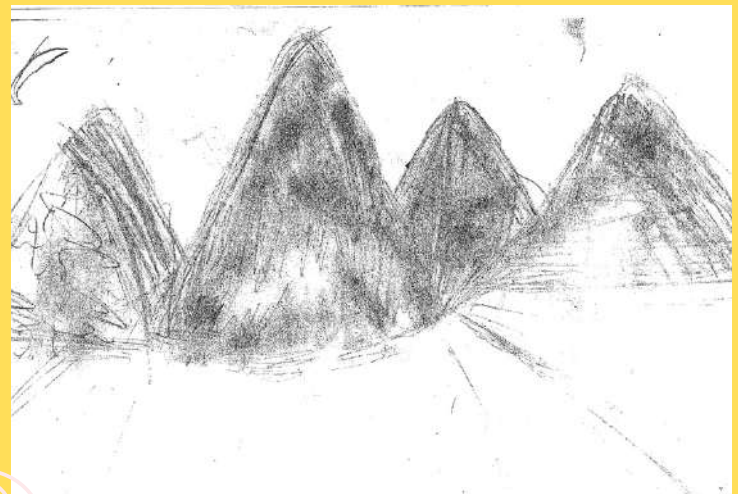


## YEAR 6 ART

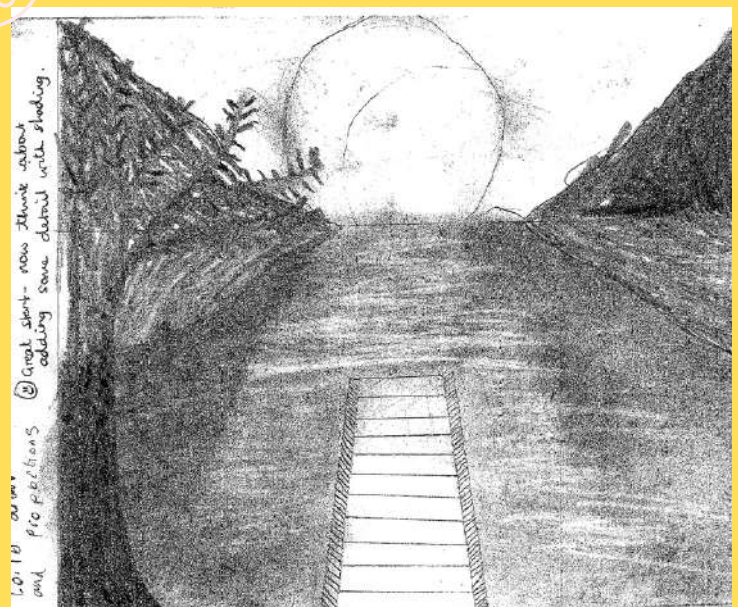
Year 6 students have delivered some fantastic drawings in their Art lessons. They were challenged to draw a landscape considering perspective and proportions

Some of our year 5's and 6's have expressed interest in science and have been given the chance to join the King's Avenue Science club after school.

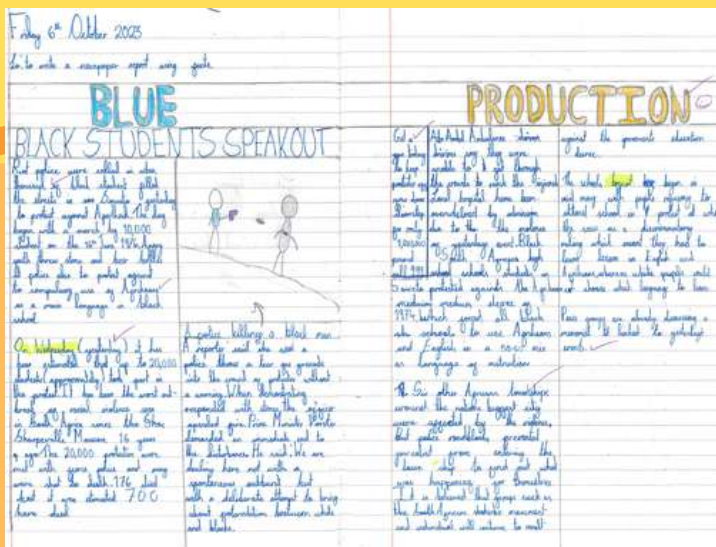
The club is run by PHD students from Imperial College London and has been a hit so far!

## YEAR 4 SCIENCE

Year 4 had very fun practical science lessons on the digestive system this term. In this lesson, they demonstrated how food is digested in different stages and is eventually expelled as poo! Yara had very sticky hands after squeezing a stocking with a mixture of food, water and orange juice inside it. In groups they took turns to demonstrate the different stages and here you can see the last stage where the cup (representing the rectum) holds the food (representing stool) and is pushed through the hole at the bottom (representing the anus).

At Kings Avenue, we encourage our pupils to engage in sport competitions to build confidence, encourage physical activity, camaraderie and teamwork.

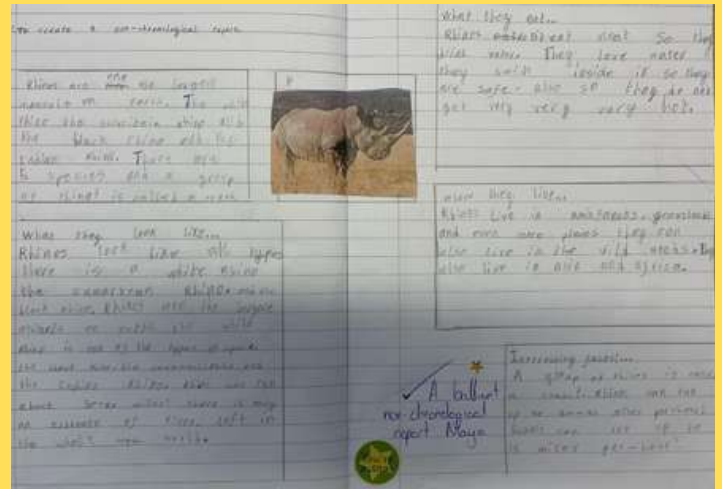

In year 1/2, we have worked very hard on creating our own non-chronological reports about rhinos. Here is an example of one of our fantastic pieces of work.



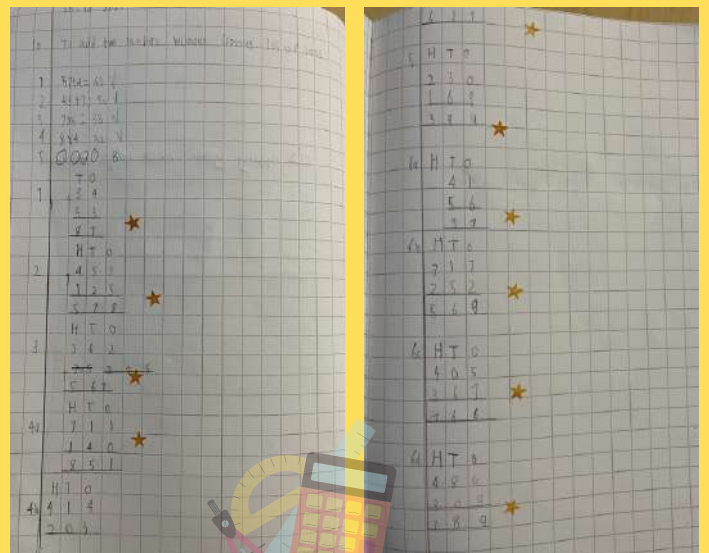

## YEAR 3 MATHS

In Maths this term, year 3 have been looking at numbers beyond 100.

This included representing, ordering, estimating and comparing numbers.

Using part-whole models, we partitioned numbers to 1,000 and recorded this as a number sentence. We used our prior knowledge of bonds within 10 to add and subtract 1s, 1s and 100s. Later in the term, we began to add and subtract numbers to 1,000 using the column method.
