OBJECTIVES FOR 2021-2022		Evaluation
Objective 1	To ensure pupils are developed as fluent readers by the end of Year 2	ACHIEVED. 95% of pupils in Year 1 passed the Phonics Screening Check in 2023. This is significantly above both local and national averages. LA ave is 78% National Ave is 79%
Objective 2	To address the gaps created by the COVID19 Pandemic	<p>ACHIEVED: In Key Stage 1, Performance in writing and reading was well above the Lambeth average and in maths was above the Lambeth average for pupils eligible for FSM</p> <p>In year 1 PSC, pupils eligible for FSM outperformed both local and national counterparts.</p> <p>ACHIEVED: In Key Stage 2, Performance in reading, maths and writing TA was broadly in line with the Lambeth average for pupils eligible for FSM.</p>
Objective 3	To ensure pupils achieve well across the curriculum	<p>ACHIEVED Strong evidence in lessons, in work, and in discussions of pupils acquiring deep knowledge of the subjects they are learning overtime In lessons, pupils were routinely making connections between stored and current learning. They were retrieving prior knowledge efficiently and effectively.</p> <p>Teachers were implementing the curriculum as intended. They were following the sequence of the curriculum as planned. The curriculum continues to match and, in some instances, exceed the breadth and depth of the national curriculum.</p> <p>In examination subjects in both KS1 and KS2, pupils' attainment was in line with local and national averages in all subjects. In EYFS and KS1, pupils exceed this.</p>
Objective 4	To provide pupils with meaningful opportunities to understand how to be responsible, respectful, active citizens who	<p>ACHIEVED:</p> <p>In addition to the many educational visits which complemented the formal curriculum, pupils had many opportunities for wider personal development eg:</p>

	<p>contribute positively to society.</p>	<p>School council – elected by the pupils. Engaged with school staff and members of outside agencies to think of ideas to further develop the school.</p> <p>Food bank visit – children in KS2 visited the foodbank to pack food bags for those in need in the local community.</p> <p>Harvest food collection – all pupils and families brought in donations for the Harvest that were delivered to The Clapham Foodbank.</p> <p>Citizenship – Year 6 children took part in a citizenship morning consisting of mini workshops regarding fire safety, internet safety and safe and respectful travel on London transport.</p> <p>The Louder I will Sing Project – Year 6 were the first primary aged pupils to take part in this. The focus was on local history (The Brixton Uprisings) and how Restorative Justice can be used in times of anger or strife.</p> <p>Anti- gang workshop – Year 5 and year 6 children took part in this workshop where a volunteer from a charity came to talk about the real threats that gangs bring to individuals and to society.</p> <p>Threats Facing Wildlife – All children took part in workshops that ranged from ‘Precious Primates’ in Key Stage 1 to ‘Should animals have the same rights as humans?’ in Upper Key stage 2.</p>
